If your household income is at or below 200% of Federal Poverty Level identified below AND your home has not been weatherized since 1994.

Energy Assistance Program (EA)

November 1 through March 31

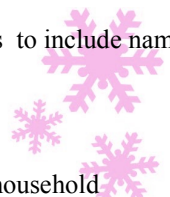
EA is a federally-funded program which assists low-income households once each winter with home heating costs as funds are available. Benefits are based on the number of people in the household, household income, and the type of fuel used to heat the home. Payment is made to the primary heating vendor. The last day to apply for assistance is March 31 of each year. Applications for this mail-in program are available at all Northeast Missouri Community Action Agency offices.

- No Disconnect Needed
- Payments made directly to supplier
- One Time Payment
- Primary Heating Source

(Propane, Fuel Oil, Natural Gas, Wood, Kerosene, and Electric)

To Apply: Bring the following to your local Community Action Agency:

- Copy of last heating bill (needs to include name and account number)
- Prior month's income
- Social Security cards for ALL household members



All Funds are based on eligibility criteria.

Energy Crisis Intervention Program

(ECIP)

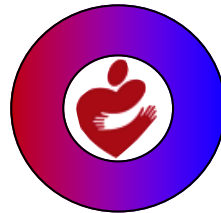
ECIP provides financial assistance to households whose utility services are off or in threat of being disconnected. Benefit amount is the amount to resolve crisis.

Winter funding is available October through May

- Payments made directly to supplier
- Disconnect Needed/Under 20% in Propane Tank
- Assists with Propane, Fuel Oil, Natural Gas, Wood, Electric, and Kerosene
- \$800 maximum based on available funds

Summer funding is available June through September

- Payments made directly to supplier
- Disconnect Needed
- Pays Electric Bills Only
- Provides Air Conditioning Units
- \$300 maximum based on available funds



Weatherization Information

Weatherization includes an Auditor assessment of the home/unit for structural air leaks, furnace and water heater functioning, gas leaks, carbon monoxide levels, air seal quality, adequacy of attic, walls, floor and rim joist insulation, window caulking, duct seals. The Auditor will perform combustion analysis testing to determine the efficiency and safety of existing furnaces and make recommendations based on these tests and weatherization program guidelines. Some furnaces may be replaced based on low efficiency and/or health and safety threat to the resident. Primary window, screen window, or door replacements are occasionally made but must meet very stringent program criteria.

To Apply for Weatherization call 660-665-9855 or 1-800-737-3165 to schedule an appointment and complete an NMCAA Intake and Weatherization Application.

Bring these items to your appointment:

- Social Security Cards of ALL household members
- Income documentation for past six (6) months for everyone over 18 residing in household (examples: pay stubs, bank statements, direct deposit wages, Social Security or other benefits)
- or Completed Tax Form (most recent)
- Proof of home ownership (recorded deed or contract to purchase or mortgage, or property tax receipt)
- Landlord contact information—if renter—name, address, phone number of landlord
- Primary and secondary heating/utility bill

Eligible applicants will be placed on the weatherization waitlist until selected. The Home Auditor will meet with you and determine what can be done on the home. An NMCAA Home Auditor will return for a final inspection once the work is completed.
